Presenters will demonstrate model lessons and then help you take your lesson ideas and facilitate the process for developing them into effective lessons for your students. In addition, we'll assist you to incorporate strategies for supporting at-risk learners such as special education students and English Language learners so that every student in your class can make progress toward achieving greater language proficiency. Bring your laptop or work on the computers in the lab. Participants are also strongly encouraged to bring a memory stick if they do not have their own computer.

<u>Prerequisites:</u> Basic computer knowledge, including Internet use, ability to manage the computer's directory system, & ability to use basic word-processing programs. This is an intensive five-day workshop. Full participation is needed for successful completion.
