And I want to say a word here about the term "Turnaround." I believe this word indicates the astute perception you Kiwanis have for the obstacles these scholarship recipients have faced.

One of the critical skills we can develop in life is the ability to course correct...to turn around when the path we are walking starts to lead us away from where we want to go.

This is not the kind of skill that is taught. It is a skill that only can be learned. And our ability to develop it depends on our persistence, our courage, and our strength of character.

I applaud you for honoring the tremendous effort that Turnaround students have dedicated to learning this essential skill.

By raising scholarships for these young people, you honor their resilience in overcoming adversity, and their determination to obtain an education.

You give them the resources they need to achieve their dreams.

I know the Kiwanis motto is this:

"Serving the children of the world. One child, one community at a time."

But as I look around this room...

...and as I sense the cumulative power of 51 years of successful scholarship fundraising...
